

# Tissue Paper Flower Pots

## Instructions:

1. First you will need to gather all of the materials for this project. You will need a paintbrush for the glue, and something to cover your workspace so that it is easier to clean up. This could be a trash bag, old newspaper, paper towels or something else you have at home.
2. Pour some of your glue into the cup. Start with just a little bit, you won't need the entire bottle of glue.
3. Your tissue paper should be already cut, but if you want to tear it to make it smaller or different you can!
4. Start spreading glue with the paintbrush over small areas of your pot. Once an area has been covered in glue, take some tissue paper and put it on that spot. Continue the process until your whole pot is covered. If some of the tissue paper still sticks out away from your pot that's okay! We'll fix that next.
5. Once you've covered your whole pot in tissue paper you are going to add another coat, or layer of glue all over your pot. This will fix the parts of the tissue paper that are sticking up and make sure that they stay on your pot.
6. Wait for the glue to dry.
7. Now you're done! Once the glue is dry your pot is ready for the next project, planting your flower seeds!



## Materials:

- Flower Pot
- Tissue Paper
- White Elmer's Glue
- Dixie Cup
- Paint Brush\*
- Something to cover your workspace\*
